I'm thrilled to share some exciting updates on The Greater Sum Foundation's impact this past year. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we were able to raise \$22k in individual donations, which we matched with \$35k in grants and pitch competition prizes. We also launched a new fundraising curriculum for our accelerator program and welcomed participants, alumni, and volunteers to The Greater Sum Network, our new online platform for self-paced learning, discussion, and events.

As we log more cohorts and stay in touch with program alumni, we're getting a better sense of what means most to their success...

<u>The Urban Institute</u> recently released a study that identifies four main supports nonprofits need to thrive: sustainability, opportunities for learning, strong relationships, and influence.


Prabha Dublish, Senior Product Manager, Grow Therapy

1st Place - \$10,000 Prize Winner

Respond: Crisis Translation provides fast, accurate, and empathetic translation and interpretation to support NGOs, nonprofits, human rights organizations, asylum seekers, and migrants. It is a coalition of multilingual people who refuse to be silent amidst xenophobic policies that negate migrants' basic human right to safety. Since 2019, they have translated over 34,00 pages, performed over 990,000 minutes of phone interpretation, and have served over 7000 clients in 108+ languages.

Brain Education Strategies Technologies (BEST) provides resources to help those with brain injury and other medical conditions impacting cognition. BEST offers brain injury survivors with practical apps, strategies, and training. The organization's goal is to teach individuals to use smart devices as cognitive prosthetics. BEST transforms lives by helping survivors reclaim their independence.
